

„Czternastka” in Bergen - Norway

According to the project's plan "From a board to a tablet - a journey with a data tablet across monuments of UNESCO heritage of Norway and Poland" 20 students and 8 teachers went to Bergen, Norway between 22nd and 27th October. After arriving to school in Fjell, the Norwegians showed us the presentation about UNESCO heritage in Poland and Norway. Students from our school had a chance to present their knowledge on historical monuments and major information about the two countries in a quiz prepared by Norwegian friends.

During the following days, teenagers took part in sport and science competitions in the centre called "Viv Vite". We could admire amazing historical monuments included in UNESCO World Heritage List like: Brygen town, Segnofjore fiords, wooden stave church Fautof stavkirke.

In the old part of Brygen there are wooden buildings located near each other. There are museums, restaurants and small shops. The narrow streets between the buildings are tiled in wood. Sognefiord is the longest and the deepest fiord in Norway. We could admire it travelling by a ferry. The weather was great at the beginning but later it changed into a cloudy and rainy day (typical for this part of the region).

Fiords are deep bays deeply put inside the land. High and almost perpendicular stone walls raise over 1000m above the sea level, only to unexpectedly change into mild coast with farms and small towns. There are a lot of waterfalls coming from the tops of the rocks. All the participants were fascinated by the incredible views. On the last day of the visit in school in Fjell, the parents of Norwegians students brought different dishes. We ate the dinner together, talked and took photos.
